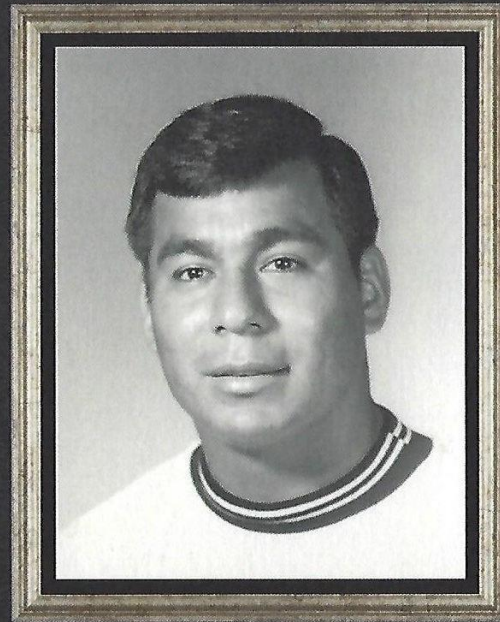

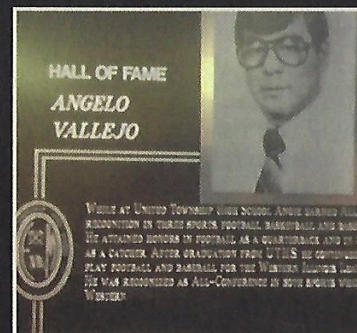

While at United Township High School, Angelo earned all-star recognition in three sports: football, basketball, and baseball. He attained honors in football as a quarterback and in basketball as a center. After graduation from UTHS he continued to play football and baseball for the Waterloo Indians. Angelo was recognized as All-Conference in both sports while at Waterloo.

*My father lived an amazing life, and we should be and are celebrating it. Dad grew up in East Moline. He was one of fourteen children. His love for sports was quickly known and he became quite an athlete. Because of his athletic abilities, he was awarded an athletic scholarship and he was the only one in his family able to attend college.*

*My parents met while dad was teaching and coaching in Astoria, Illinois. Mom was teaching at a town nearby. They married in 1969 and moved to Aurora, Illinois in 1970. They both started working in East Aurora School District.*

*I was born in 1971. Dad continued to teach and coach various sports and mom became an administrator in the district. Dad retired in 1998 and began his career as "Grandpa" in 1999. Throughout the years, he spent time with our family and enjoyed his time doing various activities. After mom passed in 2015, dad sold the house in St. Charles and moved into the house he and my mom were planning to move to in Geneva. He continued to do his daily activities without mom, but could tell he missed her greatly.*

*Dad was diagnosed with Pulmonary Fibrosis in February 2017. In June 2018, dad moved to Arizona with our family. His health started to rapidly decline due to the fibrosis. We are grateful that he was able live with us so we could care for him. As he faced his final days, he never had one moment of self-pity. He spoke about his faith and wanted us to know that he accepted Jesus and what HE had planned for him.*
